













بسم الله هذا القصر العلوي/ لا مير شمس المعالي/ الا مير بن الا مير/ قابوس بن وشمگیر/ امر ببنائه في حياته/ سنة سبع
و تسعين/ و ثمانة قمرية/ و سنة خمس و سبعين/ و ثمانة شمسية

Translation: In the name of God/ This is the high palace (*qasr*) for the Amir Shams al-Ma'ali/ The Amir son of the Amir/ Qabus ibn Wushmgir/ He ordered it built during his lifetime/ In the year three hundred
ninety-seven lunar/ And the year three hundred seventy-five solar.
